 - iv. Currently surveying my students; from 15 responses so far, this is first online class for 11 students (not counting last spring); of the other 4 students, only one has taken more than one online class

 - i. Linda Brault WestED thanks to funding through MCOE;
 two part-day online trainings; STILL PLENTY OF ROOM
 TO ENROLL
- c. Updates to Certificate requirements
 - i. Core skills certificate no changes but would like
 Advisory Committee approval to submit to chancellors
 office for official approval APPROVED
 - Makes issuing certificates official function for enrollment services; certificates will show on transcripts
 - ii. Certificate of Achievement
 - 1. Coursework that leads to AS degree
 - 2. Aligned with Teacher Permit requirements
 - a. ECE222 Curriculum and Strategies for
 Children with special needs went from a 2 unit
 to a 3 unit class (CAP alignment & instructor
 urging) so certificate must go through
 approval process again goes from 42.5 to
 43.5 units



- b. Required to list specific courses rather than categories like the matrix does: The current list of GE courses is outdated with some courses no longer available
- c. Karen is working on it
- d. Need Advisory Committee Approval to make changes APPROVED
- d. Spring schedule planning
 - i. All online again
- 4. Child Development Training Consortium update REVIEW FLYER
 - a. CDE changed the funding and there is no more funding for a local College CDTC Coordinator
 - i. Per unit funding was increased and percentage to support college personnel to promote and oversee the program was included
 - ii. COM is also contributing to sustain the support
 - iii. I will continue to do the role now called CDTC Campus

 Administrator
 - b. New payment to COM is based on \$46/eligible unit submitted by student application



- i. We will be able to issue grants of \$35/eligible unit after successful completion APPROVED
- c. Increased eligibility for students who are not working
- d. Applications direct to CDTC online; self-certification of employment
- 5. Early Childhood Education Community Workforce (ECECW) project update
 - a. Two cohorts of students have completed 12 units for the core skills certificate with support from Maricruz Aldana through CAM
 - i. Multiple funding sources (including COM Strong Workforce and Perkins funding); some funding was cut and so the third cohort we had planned to launch in Spring 2021 will not happen
 - b. Opportunity to support GE courses with concurrent engagement in a non-credit course using Adult Education Block grant funds; Considerations include:
 - i. Counseling 101: This course provides College of Marin students with an introduction to campus services,
 programs, degree and transfer requirements, and



college culture. Students develop an educational plan and learn strategies for success in college. (CSU) [May also be offered as a noncredit course; please see schedule of classes for more information.]
